Dear parents,

It is hard to believe that I am writing this as my last Wednesday letter of the 2010-2011 school year. Just a reminder to parents of incoming Senior Kindergarten students,

In order for you to plan ahead for the 2010-2011 school year, please be aware that your child will require additional immunizations prior to the start of school in the fall. Although your child was up to date during the last school year, three additional immunizations are required at the 5 year old kindergarten level.

Additional immunization requirements may include a dose of DTaP and/or polio (your child needs to have received one dose of each after their 4th birthday or within the 4-day grace period prior to the date of their 4th birthday). The other vaccinations required are second doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) and Varicella (chickenpox). These vaccinations are usually included in your child's 5-year-old check up with the pediatrician.

For your convenience, I have included the age/grade requirements for student immunizations and a Student Immunization Record. If the school already has a copy of your child's immunization record, just fill in the date(s) your child received the additional vaccines and return it to school.

As always, you do have the option of a waiver if you would prefer your child not receive these additional immunizations. The waiver section (step 4) needs to be completed on the student immunization record and returned to the school office if you wish to exercise this option.

Please remember to sign the Immunization Record prior to submitting it to the school office, as unsigned records will not be accepted.

If you have questions, please leave a message for me at the school office. I will return your call as soon as possible, usually within a day or two.

Parents of incoming 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students,

Your child will need additional immunizations prior to the start of school in the fall. You are receiving this notice now so that you can plan ahead.

The state of Wisconsin now requires tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis booster and a second dose of Varicella (chickenpox) for all students entering the 6th through 9th grades. However, if your child has received a dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine, within the past 5 years, they are compliant and don't need an additional dose.

For your convenience I have also enclosed a copy of the age/grade requirements for student immunizations and a Student Immunization Record. If the school already has a copy of your child's immunization record, just fill in the date(s) your child received the additional vaccines and return it to school.

As always, you do have the option of a waiver if you would prefer your child not receive these additional immunizations. The waiver section (step 4) needs to be completed on the student immunization record and returned to the school office if you wish to exercise this option.

Please remember to sign the Student Immunization Record prior to returning it to the school office, as unsigned records will not be accepted.

If you have any general questions, please contact the school office and leave a message for me. I will return your call as soon as I can, usually within a day or two. Specific questions regarding the immunizations should be discussed with your child's personal physician.

2. DTP/DTaP/DT/Td vaccine for students entering **Pre K and grades 1 through 12**: Four doses are required. However, if your child received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. (Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable).
3. Tdap means adolescent tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis vaccine. If your child received a dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine, such as Td, within 5 years of entering the grade in which Tdap is required, your child is compliant and a dose of Tdap vaccine is not required.
4. Polio vaccine for students entering grades **Kindergarten through 12**: Four doses are required. However, if your child received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. (Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable).
5. The first dose of MMR vaccine must have been received on or after the first birthday (Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 1st birthday is also acceptable).
6. Var means Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. A history of chickenpox disease is also acceptable.

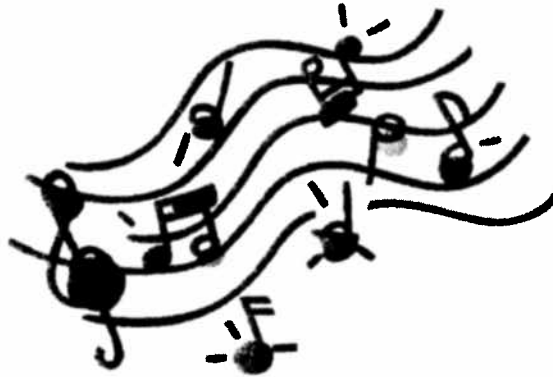

We are in the planning stages of the **2011 SJOA Robo-Knights Lego League**.

Your children attended a short demonstration in the multipurpose room at the end of 2010 and learned what Lego League is all about. Here is a little information for you parents:

We start league meetings right away in September, getting together 2x per week in the school library. Exact times and days will be determined as we get closer. Your feedback on this is appreciated. It has worked very well for the past two years to meet right after school so parents do not have to make double trips. We've learned that it's best to start meetings as early in the year as possible to get the kids acclimated to the program and each other. This is very important as it is one of the few school programs at SJOA where children from different age groups work as a team. By the time the theme, or challenge, is announced in mid-September, we'll be ready to go! The program is **lead by the students** with 2-4 (depending on the size of the group) parent volunteers with them at all times for guidance.

The teams trade off working the following:

- building the challenge course
- engineering and building the robot
- researching the challenge topic for their oral and visual presentation to be presented at competition

The competition will be held in November. The nationwide competition is divided into hundreds of regional and local competitions. In 2010, we competed against at least 40 Wisconsin schools at the Marquette University High School tournament in Milwaukee. There are also tournaments in Mukwanago, Brookfield, and Watertown to name a few other tournaments close by to choose from. The competition marks the conclusion of the program for the year.

Parent & Student Requirements:

- Two meetings per week (days TBD), two hours each meeting from mid-late August through November.
- Students must be 9 years old by September 1st.
- We are looking for 2 parent volunteers to help direct the students at meetings.
- Since meetings will be directly after school, snacks are welcome!

CMH Musicians Only High School Ensemble at Jazz in Cutler Park

The Catholic Memorial High School (CMH) Jazz Ensemble and Show Choir are confirmed to perform at the Les Paul bandshell in Cutler Park on Wednesday, June 8th at 7:00 pm. For the second year running, CMH student musicians will be the only high school ensemble to appear on the schedule.

“*Jazz in Cutler Park* offered area high schools the opportunity to perform in their summer series, and we just jumped at the chance.” said CMH instrumental and choral director Pete Lange. “It is an honor to showcase our students’ hard work and talent to the public.”

Twenty four members of the CMH Jazz Ensemble will be featured at Wednesday’s concert, including two CMH Alumni, Philip Engsberg ’09 on the saxophone and Samuel Engsberg ’10 on the trumpet. Eleven members of the CMH Show Choir will also be performing.

Lange, a working musician, has substantial influence on the local jazz scene. The Pete Lange Quartet, where Lange plays acoustic guitar, frequently performs at various clubs and restaurants throughout Milwaukee and Waukesha County.

Jazz at Cutler Park is a free concert series that takes place every Wednesday evening from 7 to 9, at the Les Paul Performance Center at Cutler Park in downtown Waukesha, Wisconsin. This year’s *Jazz in Cutler Park* lineup runs until Wednesday, August 3rd. 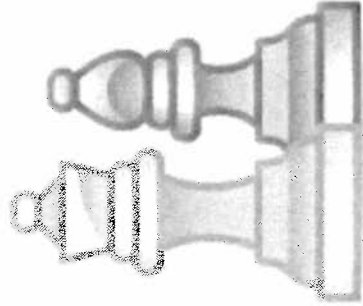
